Sunday 11th May: Edinburgh

Renaissance Band *Viol Rackett*

Edinburgh Renaissance Band presents its ever-popular Viol Rackett Show, our best-loved programme of music and song from the Middle Ages to the Renaissance. The musicians show off a large range of period instruments (not just viols and rackets!) including shawms, cornetti, sackbuts, nakers, crumhorns, fiddles, recorders, crumhorns, gemshorns, bells, bagpipes, and a serpent. The concert is fronted by Musical Director Murray Campbell, whose lively presentation provides a show that is a truly joyous experience for all members of the family.

Saturday 17th May: Dalkeith & Monktonall Colliery Brass Band

Sally Simpson, virtuoso violinist, formerly a member of *Spurtle* and now studying at the Royal Scottish Conservatoire, will delight us all with her mixture of traditional and contemporary music and some light classical pieces.

Saturday 31st May: Philomusica of Edinburgh

Philomusica of Edinburgh present a programme of popular classics including Grieg's Holberg Suite, Bach's Concerto for two violins, and Copland's *Quiet City*, and featuring Scottish songs with soloist Carole Clarke.
