Thanks to your generosity we have been able in the lat year to:

- Appoint an administrator for 6 hours a week
- Commit funds to groups like Wednesday Wonderings
- Start the long term control of the trees in our garden
- Pay the additional costs for Zoom provision
- Repair the tiles in chancel
- Plan for the renovation of the Muirhead Room as a cosy community space.
- Ensure that we pay Living Wage
- Pay 21% of the costs of the ramp

Due to current living conditions for our priest, we are currently **saving about £4000 per year** (council tax, utilities and ongoing maintenance of the rectory) and we have received money from rents to start to renovate the house.

St Mark's into the future

We want to:

- Make our **church** sustainable for the future
- Provide adequate **housing** for our priest our rectory is in poor repair and does not meet minimum requirements for a priest (requires a further £55,000)
- Ensure our church has a paid **ministry** to inspire and nurture us now and in the future
- Maintain this active church with a mission at the heart of our community which sustains us and nurtures us in our lives.
- Be able to meet rising costs of utilities and of paid staff with fewer volunteers

Our dream:

To free up time and resources to concentrate on mission and service in the local community

To focus on the renovation of our building, knowing that the mission and ministry are financially secure

To ensure that we can support a full time priest into the future
